

CHS Graduation Requirements:

To be eligible for graduation, every student must successfully complete a minimum of 24 credits. One credit equals one full school year of study

- **4 English credits**
- **3 Social Studies credits** to include: World History, U.S. History, and U.S. Government
- **3 Math credits**
- **1 Physical Education credit**
- **1 Health credit**
- **1 Computer Literacy credit:** this is fulfilled by Word Processing, Desktop Publishing, Tech Drawing or Computer Science. 9th graders can only take Word Processing or Tech Drawing
- **2 Science credits,** to include: Physical Science and Biology
- **1 Fine Arts credit:** This can be fulfilled by Art, Graphic Art, Ceramics, Sculpture, Band, Jazz Band, Chorus, or Photojournalism
- **1 Career Preparation credit**
- **7 elective credits**

9th Grade

1. English
2. Math
3. World History
4. Physical Science
5. Physical Education
6. 3 elective credits

Most 9th grade students choose to take their computer literacy credit and/or an art credit. English, Math, and Science have applied, college prep, and honors levels. World history has applied and college prep levels.

10th Grade

1. English
2. Math
3. Health
4. Biology
5. 4 elective credits

Many 10th grade students choose to take their computer literacy or art credit if they didn't the year prior. Sophomores are also able to take 2 periods of a St. Croix Regional Technical Center class. English, Math, and Biology have applied, college prep, and honors levels.

11th Grade

1. English
2. Math
3. US History
4. Career Prep
5. 4 Elective Credits

11th grade students are able to take 2 or 4 periods of a St. Croix Regional Technical Center class. English is offered in Advanced Placement, college prep, and applied levels. Advanced math classes like trigonometry and calculus are offered if students have taken the prerequisite classes.

12th Grade

2. US Government
3. 6 Elective Credits

12th Grade students are able to take 2 or 4 periods of a St. Croix Regional Technical Center class. English is offered in advanced placement, college prep, and applied levels.
